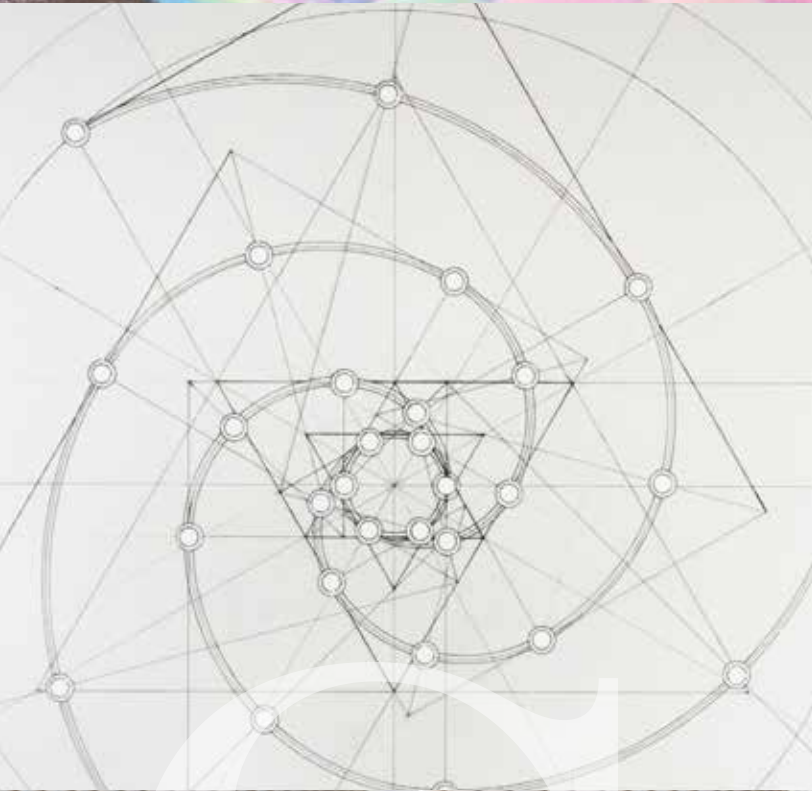

One-of-a-kind works in the form of sea creatures (real or fantasy) are staples in the collections of top artists wooing the covetable one percent. Rare opals of the Australian and Ethiopian variety offer a play of colour that's ideal for placement in skeletal mermaid pendants and pink-sapphire-bodied seahorses that slink around the wrist in a demure fashion. Paraiba tourmaline, too, has a home in one-offs, considering its hard-to-obtain status and unforgettable scuba blue hue. Current silhouettes like y-shape collars and oversize drop earrings serve as perches for anemone-like blue sapphire and emerald algae to cling to necklines and leggy octopi with proprietary stone cuts to tread imaginary water from the lobes of one lucky buyer. High-end designers are finding that when it comes to unrepeatable pieces, ocean motifs appeal to many.

Silhouettes: brooches, cuffs, bypass rings, wide bands, y necklaces, drop earrings, long pendants, single statement earrings.

Aesthetic: fantasy, whimsy, magical, inventive.

Materials: rose, white, and white gold with black rhodium, platinum, Australian boulder opals, Coober Pedy opal, Ethiopian opals, diamonds, sapphires, emeralds, Paraiba tourmaline.

Colours: blue, green, white, pink, black, orange.
